## Excess Charges - HHG Transportation in Excess of Authorized Weight Allowance (JTR, par. 051306-B)

Note: The rates and costs in this example may not be current and are for illustrative purposes only.
Scenario: A Service member with a weight allowance of 8,000 pounds transports 8,500 pounds of authorized articles. The cost to transport the total weight of 8,500 pounds is $\$ 5,000$. The cost of the excess net weight ( 500 pounds) is prorated based on the cost of total net weight transported $(500 / 8,500)$. The Service member is financially responsible for $\$ 300$.

Computing Excess Cost

| Authorized weight | $8,000 \mathrm{lbs}$. |
| :--- | ---: |
| Weight actually transported | $8,500 \mathrm{lbs}$. |
| Excess net weight | $8,500-8,000=500 \mathrm{lbs}$. |
| Ratio used for prorated cost of excess net weight | $500 / 8,500=0.06$ |
| Cost to transport total weight (8,500 lbs.) | $\$ 5,000$ |
| Cost for excess weight | $\$ 5,000 \times 0.06=\$ 300$ |
